Home Movie Duplication



Tape to DVD (easy method)

The Sanyo DVD Recorder will copy home movies from VHS or VHS-C tape to DVD, or from your home video camera to DVD. Allow yourself enough time to transfer your movies. The DVD can hold up to 2hours of video, and also needs up to 1-hour to finalize the DVD for playback on your home equipment.



Finalize the DVD

The DVD must be finalized before it will play on your home DVD player or on your home computer. You will need the remote control, which is available for sign-out at the front desk.
