
Plant Swap

- Take any "leftover" plants home again.



Throughout the design you can see the salmon swimming in the foreground and the dark blue shadows of salmon swimming below. It was important for me to continue the design around the entire vehicle as if the salmon were swimming around the truck on a journey as it travels through the community.

The title of this piece is A Journey Within—representing the journey of the salmon, mirroring journeys of the local communities' adults and children.

Kelly Cannell is a Coast Salish artist from the Musqueam Nation. We thank her for her meaningful and strikingly beautiful design.
