


City Centre Refresh

In July, the exterior of our City Centre branch got a new look, thanks to the City of Coquitlam.

City Centre now boasts:

- fresh exterior paint and eye-catching art panels designed by artist Carolyn Wong
- cheerful painting on the sidewalk near the Pinetree Way entrance
- modular seating in the plaza by Henderson Mall, and café seating along the perimeter of the branch



The updates will continue into the interior of the branch, with new paint and carpeting.

While we look forward to these improvements, they will cause disruptions to our programming, services, and access to some areas in the Library. During this time, workers will be on site, and construction noise is to be expected.




